Welsh Government Guidance – Covid Testing

From Monday 11 October, WG has recommended that students who are under 18 and have a household member who has tested positive for COVID-19 should, in addition to PCR tests on Day 2 and Day 8, undertake a daily lateral flow test every day for seven days. This should start on the day a household contact is confirmed positive from a lateral flow or PCR test result. Where appropriate, they want to reduce the testing of children without symptoms but due to the increase in prevalence and the concerns expressed about household contacts, they consider it is vital that we do all we can to keep children in school.

As of 11 October, any learners in secondary school who are under 18 and confirmed as a household contact should start using lateral flow tests for 7 days immediately to help provide further reassurance that they are not infectious to others.

Ariane Allford, Y7, is a competitive Artistic Roller Skater. Outside of school, she trains every Friday, Saturday and Sunday with her Club - Cardiff City Rollers - and travels around the country throughout the year competing in local and National competitions, a huge commitment. At the end of this month for the first time she will be representing her club by competing in the British Championships. It will be a tough competition but Ariane feels it is a privilege to represent her club.



Just before the summer she placed 4th out of 21 in her category in the summer Back to Skate competition held by the Federation of Artistic Roller Skating (newly rebranded to GB Skate Artistic) - their first competition since the beginning of the pandemic.

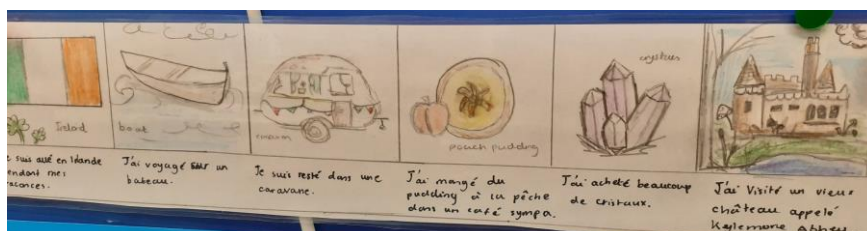

NATASHA'S LAW

Natasha's Law (or the Food Information (Amendment) Regulations 2019) came into force on the 1st October 2021 making it a legal requirement for all food businesses to display full ingredient and allergen labelling on every food item they sell pre-packaged for direct sale.

This may mean that some of the range of 'pre-packed' sandwiches, baguettes and salads may be limited following the introduction of this Law.
