The Year Ahead and Key Stage 4 Course Options process

Soon we will commence the 'Options process' whereby Year 9 students decide their Key Stage Four courses. We appreciate it is an exciting and daunting prospect for students and parents, and have put together this helpful guide to the year and the support and processes involved. All students in Wales study **Core courses,** including English Language and Literature, Mathematics and Numeracy, Science, Welsh, Physical Education, Well Being and the Welsh Baccalaureate. Additionally, students have some choice to select **non-core** qualifications, so need to consider how they best study as well as what they study, having the opportunity to opt to study their passions and interests. Students can select a large number of GCSEs and choose only GCSEs, if that is appropriate for them. Alternatively, students can combine GCSEs with Level 1 or 2 vocational qualifications.

At Monmouth Comprehensive, we believe in offering a wide range of non-core course options. Some subjects are more "applied" or more practical than others, and are assessed in a different way from more traditional exams. The process of choosing courses is in two steps:

Step 1 is to take part in the **Free Choice** Survey: students select FIVE non-core courses from the survey.

Step 2 is to complete the Block Choice Survey: students select FOUR courses from the Option blocks.

Details of all our subjects will be given in our Year 9 Options booklet, published on the 7th November. Information on further communication points and key dates across the remainder of the academic year are outlined below.

This is an in-person event held in school. A large number of higher and further education institutions and employers exhibit at MCS and are able to field questions from students and their families about future applications and potential career paths, and what qualifications therefore may be helpful to select for Key Stage Four.

Block Choice Form Submission Deadline

Friday 13th February

Deadline for the submission of the final course choices, via paper form. Staff will review courses and their appropriateness for students and contact parents accordingly.

Key Stage 4 lessons begin

Monday 1st June

Key Stage Four courses begin for students in Year 9. Students will follow their new GCSE timetable and meet their GCSE teachers.

Annual Summary Report

Monday 14th July

These reports are emailed home. The report summarises Year 9 performance, attainment and wellbeing (it will not contain data on new Key Stage Four courses as they will have only just begun).
